Freemasons Willson Lewis Scholarships

The Manawatū Kilwinning Lodge No. 47, in conjunction with Master Builders Manawatu Branch, Master Painters and UCOL Te Pūkenga are pleased to offer at least two scholarships for further study to qualified trades people.

The aim of the scholarship is to assist those aspiring to broaden their career and become involved in the wider trades industry in the Manawatū and Whanganui regions.

The successful applicants will receive a scholarship from the Freemasons Willson Lewis Trust up to \$6,000, which covers up to 50% of each paper fee. Applicants can apply for whole qualifications or for individual papers. There may be an opportunity for previous study and experience to be recognised against programme requirements, reducing the amount of time required to complete your study.

The eligible qualifications are below. A full list of papers per qualification is available on request.

- **New Zealand Certificate in Construction Trades Supervision** - 1 year full-time / 2 years part-time. Learn soft skills for people and project management in a Trades setting. Delivered via in-work assessment, on-campus night courses and online delivery. Applicable to all Trades.
- **New Zealand Diploma in Business** - 1 year full-time / 2 years part-time. Applicable to all Trades.
- **New Zealand Diploma in Construction (with strands in Construction Management and Quantity Surveying)** - 2 years full-time / 4 years part-time. Applicable to Construction Trades.
- **New Zealand Diploma in Architectural Technology** - 2 years full-time / 4 years part-time. Applicable to Construction Trades.

These qualifications can be studied either full-time (8 papers per year) or part-time (1-4 papers per year), enabling the applicant to continue full-time employment. Qualifications can also be studied paper by paper, allowing for more flexibility. Successful applicants will need to show continuous engagement over a period of up to 5 years of studying. Applicants who are not engaged may have their scholarship withdrawn.

Applicants Must:

- Work and live in the district covered by the Manawatū Branch and Whanganui Branch of Registered Master Builders New Zealand and Manawatu Branch of Master Painters New Zealand;
- Have completed at least half of an apprenticeship within the trades industry by 31 December 2023 and be a Registered Master Builder or Painter, or in the employment of a Registered Master Builder or Painter, in the above district;
- Show continuous engagement over a period of up to 5 years of studying. Applicants who are not engaged may have their scholarship withdrawn.
- Be a New Zealand citizen or hold permanent New Zealand residency;
- Demonstrate a will to succeed in the trades;
- Have leadership skills; and
- Have proven community commitment.

Applications close 20 October 2023 and must be made on this Freemasons Willson Lewis Scholarship application form.

As part of the application process, applicants will be required to attend a 30 minute interview in early November 2023. The successful applicants will be announced at an event held at UCOL in November.
