Youth Guarantee

UCOL offers Youth Guarantee Scholarships under the government's Youth Guarantee Initiative.

Are you under 25 years old and keen to try vocational education? UCOL has Youth Guarantee Scholarships for students who show commitment to study and their career.

What Does a Youth Guarantee Scholarship Provide?

Youth Guarantee recipients pay no fees for the year of the scholarship. Additional support and mentoring will be provided to give students the best possible chance of successfully completing their programme. This may include transport and mandatory course related costs.

Am I Eligible?

To be eligible you need to meet all the following criteria:

- You must be under 25 years of age at the start of your chosen programme.
- You must attend an interview and engage in a personal education planning process.
- You must not have studied at a tertiary institution before or have achieved a level 3 qualification. (Please note, this does not include STAR, U-Skills or Gateway programmes).
- You must be a New Zealand citizen or permanent resident.
- You should enrol in one of the programmes identified by UCOL as meeting the criteria for funding.

Please Note: An applicant MUST have reached 16 years of age and be under the age of 25 years by the first day of their chosen programme. Youth Guarantee Scholarship students 16-17 years old are not eligible for any kind of loans or allowances from StudyLink, however, 18-24 year olds may be able to access the Student Loan Scheme for living costs and/or Student Allowance from StudyLink, on a case-by-case basis).

Youth Guarantee recipients also need to agree to the following conditions:

- Each student will have a nominated support person (if under 18, this must be a parent or legal guardian).
- Each student's progress will be monitored by a designated UCOL Youth Guarantee staff member.
- In order to support the Youth Guarantee programme, students may be required to participate in research.

How Do I Make an Application?

Early application is encouraged. Applications for scholarships will be considered in order of receipt.

A mid-year intake for programmes that start in the second semester will be dependent on the availability of scholarships.

Applicants must also complete a UCOL Application Form for their preferred programme when they complete the Youth Guarantee application. Places for Youth Guarantee recipients in each programme may be limited.

UCOL is the sole decision maker in selecting Youth Guarantee recipients.
