Across our UCOL campuses, we love to celebrate our graduands. They are making contributions and doing amazing things wherever they go. Here are some great examples, may they be a source of inspiration for us all as they work to achieve their aspirations.

Laura Papple

Master of Design

Whanganui-born and bred, Laura has an innate desire to contribute to the community that has given her so much.

"I could have studied my Master's at a university, but why would I when we have first-class tutors here in Whanganui who are not only talented artist's and practitioners in their own right but are phenomenal teachers who cultivate an safe environment that is unpack all that needs to be explored when you're studying at Master's level."

Laura's master's practice investigates skin as both container and communicator of internal states, using materials such as glass and paper to explore embodiment, vulnerability, and protection. Her master's research asks how materiality can serve as a practical inquiry into the tension between concealment and self-disclosure, using surface, scale, and translucency as active elements. Completing a Master's is an incredible feat, a student is required to have the depth of thinking and artistic practice to achieve at this level. That jump in critical thinking and unpacking is something that Laura is well-versed in now.

"I returned to UCOL for a range of reasons, with previous lecturer Kathryn Wightman being a key one. Between her and [lecturer] Richard Sheppard, I could not speak highly enough. They both are extremely talented artists in their own right and their knowledge bases are interdisciplinary which meant there was no place to hide, in the best way. There's so much to be said for the space they created for their students specifically at a master's level, there were times where we had to be vulnerable especially nearer the end of our studies, we had to be open and honest. I give them full credit for cultivating the safety of our learning space for that to happen."

That safety is one of the reasons why Laura chose to return to UCOL Whanganui for her Bachelor's and Master's qualifications. "UCOL Whanganui has such a warmth, community and overall support, everyone is looked after. The connections you make are strong, and your tutors genuinely care about you, they check in. If you need extra support, they have wrap around support like the Student Success team. I do recommend it as a place to study, especially for our young local creatives who are just waiting to be nurtured and grow."

For those considering beginning their journey at UCOL Whanganui, Laura says, if you have the privilege to follow your dream, do it!

"It's important that if you have the resources to allow you to, to take the time and investigate your passions. If you're thinking, should I? Can I? There's nothing wrong with pushing forward, being courageous and giving it a go!"

New Zealand Diploma in Construction

Ratu Whippy first came to New Zealand from Fiji on a sports scholarship to Kelston Boys' High School in Auckland at 15 years old, by himself. A 180-degree change in his life from Fiji island living, that for many others would be mind boggling to wrap their heads around but one that he shares with a sense of warmth and humility.

“All I knew was rugby before coming to New Zealand, and then going to Kelston Boys' just completely opened my eyes to the rest of the world really, eh. Suddenly, I became aware of all these other opportunities than just rugby.”

“That time for me was really important because I was here by myself without my family, I matured a lot at such a young age. I was making so many decisions, especially financial ones that I'd never had to consider before.”

A few years after high school, he had a feeling that UCOL was where his next step was meant to take him and he wasn't wrong. While his journey here wasn't smooth sailing, “it was the best decision I could have made” Ratu says adamantly of his experience at UCOL.

Ratu began by enrolling in the New Zealand Certificate in Construction Trade Skills (Carpentry) Level 3 and successfully graduated from that. When asked why he chose that programme, he laughs and says that's a great question!

“I guess I was looking for something that wasn't rugby. I really wanted to give something new a go, and this was really a whole new kettle of fish! When I look back now, you know, I hadn't even owned a laptop before starting here.”

“I was using YouTube to learn how to use my laptop, how to type, how to format a document, all these things that others just knew how to do, at the same time as keeping up with my learning. UCOL gave me such great support, everyone was so helpful, very informative. David and my lecturers were always asking about how my life was going to ensure they could help remove as many barriers as possible for me. That really made a difference.”

After I got through the first course, I was encouraged to come back and enrol in the Diploma (New Zealand Diploma in Construction Level 6).

“I started off good, and then I faced some hardships financially and was living from my car for a time there. Everything just kind of happened at once and things quickly spiralled so I took another break. UCOL's staff were awesome for me during this time and continued to check in with me and ended up being a motivating pillar for me to return.

Through his sheer hard work and determination, Ratu is now graduating with his Diploma in Construction and is currently contracting building decking and fencing while he looks for long-term employment in his field. To anyone thinking about studying at UCOL, or trying something completely new he says, “Take the jump, you couldn't choose a better place than UCOL. You aren't just learning new skills, but you'll find a whole community of people who are there to support you and help you succeed.”

Our Graduands

Maja Hartnell-Roño – Wairarapa Campus

Bachelor of Nursing

Born in the Philippines, Maja (pronounced Maha) came to NZ at 14 years old. This shift in her life was her first step into a completely new world and opened her eyes to a new way of living, combined with the regular teenage challenges of being young and trying to get to know oneself.

Maja is graduating with a Bachelor of Nursing from UCOL, but this isn't her first degree – after being inspired by Victoria University graduation parades, she successfully completed a Bachelor of Science majoring in Psychology and Criminology.

"I remember the pride I had completing that degree, and I went on to work in mental health for the government, which was incredibly rewarding, but after a while, I became burnt out and didn't feel like I was getting as far as expected in my career," Maja explains.

It was then that her life trajectory changed, after she met her now husband who was a farmer from the Wairarapa. "I'd always wanted to live in the country, rather than in the city so eventually I moved there too and it's just always felt like home for me."

"The content of my daily work in mental health was just too much for me at that time, so I really started considering what I wanted my life to look like. It was during this time that I really gave nursing some serious thought."


"My Well Child provider nurse for my first daughter was actually a UCOL student at the time, and by the time I had my second daughter, she was a fully-fledged Well Child nurse. Watching her journey was a huge source of inspiration for me, as was the memory of my grandfather, who always hoped I would become a nurse when I grew up. I was also deeply shaped by my mother — a strong, brave woman whose resilience taught me to chase my dreams no matter the obstacles. Her example has stayed with me throughout my life."

Maja enrolled into UCOL Wairarapa's Nursing programme while 6 months pregnant with her second child, under no illusions of the mammoth feat she was taking on. "After talking with Tracey [Cook, Academic Portfolio Manager, Nursing], about the logistics of whether I'd be able to achieve it – who was wholly supportive, I took the leap and completed all my enrolment paperwork early to ensure I'd get a place."

"While choosing UCOL Wairarapa was an easy choice in terms of logistics, I'd heard so many good things about their Nursing programme – it's very hands-on, there's lots of support, including being connected to local job opportunities, and the pass rate was high."

"The support team at UCOL was great, they're so easy to talk to and really just great people who care. Juggling a lot outside of my studies and being a mature student also meant I was able to really zone in and focus on what I needed to achieve and lean on their support when I needed it. The Learning Advisors especially, just made the academic support aspect so easy!"

Maja is now employed within the Duty Nurse Management team at Wairarapa hospital, which is giving her a wide variety of experience across different areas of the hospital, and loving soaking up every minute of it.



Academic Regalia

Modern day academic regalia originates from the High Middle Ages, the 12th and 13th centuries, when early universities adopted traditions arising from the church. Today's academic dress of the gown, hood and cap, has origins in the clerical dress of that era.

Cap

The trencher or mortar board arises from the preferred form of head dress of the laity of the medieval period. There are two styles; the bonnet and the trencher. UCOL utilises the trencher head dress in its academic regalia. It has a hard top square above a soft cap with a tassel fastened from the middle, which is worn on the left side once the wearer has graduated. The trencher is only worn by those who have been conferred with a degree.

Gowns

The gowns are based on the types of gowns used widely by both the clergy and laity of the church in the Middle Ages. Like most New Zealand institutions, the UCOL gowns are based on the University of Cambridge gowns. The UCOL Certificate, Diploma and Bachelor gowns have long, full wide-mouthed sleeves, while the Masters gown has origins in the Tudor period, with its long closed sleeves with a pocket-like extension. It has been suggested that these pockets may have originally been used to store paper and food. A korowai (cloak) may be worn by graduands or staff members over the Cambridge gown. For degree Graduands the hood is displayed over the top of the cloak.

Sash/Stole

The sash/stole had its origins in the Middle Ages as an ecclesiastical vestment in the shape of a narrow strip of material worn around the shoulders. At UCOL, Diploma holders wear a sash of gold satin and green and gold braid over the top of their gown, while Graduate or Post Graduate holders wear a coloured stole.

Hoods

The hood is a remnant of the cowl worn by monks to cover their head and shoulders in order to keep warm. When not used for warmth, it was thrown back to hang down the back, as it is worn today. The tail, which was probably longer, was used to tie around the neck in order to keep the hood on.

Only degree holders wear a hood in addition to the gown, with each degree having a designated colour. The size and shape of the UCOL hoods, like most New Zealand institutions, are based on the University of Cambridge Master of Arts hoods.

The hoods are the most colourful aspect of the regalia. Curiously, the higher the degree, the less ornate the hood usually becomes. Bachelor degrees typically have a trim of either fur or braid, in addition to the colourful hood lining. This is thought to have originated from the fact that the more senior members of monastic orders were able to sit closer to the fire, hence had less need for fur trimmed hoods which were required for warmth by the more junior members who were further from the fire. The Bachelor with Honours Degree dispenses with the fur or braid, using a plain ribbon trim, while the Masters degree has no trim to the hood.



The Official and Academic Procession Regalia

Members of the official and academic procession wear the academic dress of the institution at which they were awarded their highest qualification.

UCOL Whanganui's strong links to the community continue to be highlighted by the number of locally funded scholarships awarded each year. In 2025, 46 scholarships were awarded to UCOL Whanganui ākonga (students). The awards from nine local donors included a grant for ākonga in hardship. These scholarships make a significant difference in reducing financial pressure. Thank you to our generous scholarship donors.

We know whānau support is a key driver for ākonga success. Whakawhanaungatanga events were held each semester to welcome in whānau and friends and to establish a stronger connection.

May saw UCOL's Business team running a 6-week short course Introducing XERO accounting software. We also supported the Rangatahi in Tech expo during TechWeek, with over 100 rangatahi from local kura coming on campus to see what tech education and businesses are doing in Whanganui.

In June, we held our first Symposium of Research Presentations, where our graduating Master of Design students presented their research projects to a captive audience. The event was held at the David Lecture Theatre at the Whanganui Regional Museum.

In August, we hosted two students from Tsuruoka National Institute of Technology, Japan, where they completed an internship through in collaboration with Karetu Honey, gaining valuable hands-on industry experience while engaging with our learning community and the wider Whanganui region.

Also in August, UCOL Whanganui hosted a Tokyo Board of Education visit, including 32 students and 24 staff from Japan. UCOL Whanganui presented information about the international tertiary options in Whanganui with a design focus, and English language opportunities.

November marked a significant milestone 20 years since the first nursing students sat their State Final examination at UCOL Wanganui. Thank you to every nursing graduate, to all past and present kaiako (teachers) and support kaimahi (staff), and to all our community partners who have hosted ākonga for placement.

We ended our 2025 year with SHOW - Student Art and Design Exhibition.

Celebrating our ākonga as they graduate is a very special event that we look forward to each year. We congratulate all graduates and we wish you well in your future endeavours.

In 2025, UCOL Wairarapa continued a partnership with McKenzies 2000 Electrical, who supported our ākonga in achieving a 100 per cent pass rate in their national capstone assessment for a second year in a row. Our graduates excelled in 2025 across the board, with high success rates and most moving into paid internships or employment last year, across our suite of programs.

In 2025, we centred our activities on nurturing the whole person. The Kickstart Kai initiative received funding from the Lands Trust Foundation, and we continued to provide breakfast for our tauira, ensuring that every student started their day with nourishment and connection. Our commitment to mental health and wellbeing was strengthened through a partnership with Manawa Ora, who now offer a weekly mirimiri clinic on our Whakaoriori marae.

Through waiata sessions and whakawhanaungatanga events, we reinforced our commitment to the revitalisation of te reo Māori as a continued Kaupapa within our campus culture. Karapu Kōrero has been a continuing addition to our campus, providing a space for ākonga, kaimahi, and community members to engage in kōrero and grow their confidence in using te reo Māori out loud. This initiative has brought a diverse range of voices onto campus, strengthening connections between education, language, and our local stories of Wairarapatanga.

In partnership with Ngāti Kahungunu ki Wairarapa, Rangitāne o Wairarapa, and Café Sugar, our Pink Ribbon Breakfast raised \$1,800 through 85 tickets sold, bringing together iwi leaders and community members to support breast cancer awareness and strengthen local connections, including Matua Nelson Rangitakaiwaho and Chrissie Hape (Ngāti Kahungunu Iwi Incorporated)

We celebrate the resilience and achievements of our tauira, supported by iwi, industry, kaimahi, and the wider Wairarapa whānau. Together, we continue to nurture learning and create pathways for a strong workforce for Wairarapa.
